### Policy 0410

## Nondiscrimination in Programs and Activities

The Solano County Office of Education (SCOE) is committed to providing equal opportunity for all individuals in education and shall promote programs which ensure that discriminatory practices, harassment, intimidation, and bullying are eliminated in all its activities. SCOE programs, activities, and practices shall be free from discrimination, harassment, intimidation, and bullying based on race; color; ancestry; national origin; immigration status; ethnic group identification; age; religion; marital, parental, family, or pregnant status; physical or mental disability; sex; sexual orientation; gender; gender identity or expression; genetic information; the perception of one or more of such characteristics; or association with a person or group with one or more of these actual or perceived characteristics. (Education Code (E.C.) section 220; Government Code 11135; Penal Code section 422.55)

In addition to the above-mentioned actual or perceived characteristics, SCOE shall not discriminate against employees and job applicants based on their military or veteran status. Furthermore, SCOE shall reasonably accommodate employees' religious attire and grooming practices. (Government Code section 12940)

The County Superintendent or designee shall regularly review SCOE's programs and activities to ensure the removal of any barrier that may unlawfully prevent an individual or group in any of the protected categories stated above from accessing SCOE's programs and activities, including the use of facilities, and shall take prompt, reasonable actions to remove any identified barrier.

The County Superintendent or designee shall notify students, parents/guardians, employees, employee organizations, applicants for admission and employment, and sources of referral for applicants about SCOE's policy on nondiscrimination and related complaint procedures. Such notification shall be included in each announcement, bulletin, catalog, handbook, application form, or other materials distributed to these groups. (34 CFR 104.8, 106.9)

SCOE's nondiscrimination policy and related informational materials shall be published in a format that parents/guardians can understand and, when required by law, in a language other than English. (Education Code 48985)

#### Access for Individuals with Disabilities

SCOE programs and facilities, viewed in their entirety, shall be in compliance with the Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA) and any implementing standards and/or regulations. (28 CFR 35.150, 35.151, 35.136)

The County Superintendent or designee shall ensure that SCOE provides appropriate auxiliary aids and services when necessary to afford individuals with disabilities equal opportunity to participate in or enjoy the benefits of a service, program, or activity. These aids and services may include, but are not limited to, qualified interpreters or readers, assistive listening devices, note-takers, written materials, taped text, and Braille or large print materials. (28 CFR 35.130, 35.160, 36.303; Government Code 54953.2)

Individuals with disabilities shall notify the Superintendent, principal, or designee if they have a disability that requires special assistance or services. Reasonable notification should be given prior to the SCOE-sponsored function, program, or meeting.
