Policy 5131.62

Tobacco

The Solano County Office of Education (SCOE) recognizes that tobacco use presents serious health risks and desires to provide support and assistance in the prevention and intervention of tobacco use among youth by reducing the number of students who begin or continue to use tobacco. The Superintendent or designee shall establish a comprehensive program that includes consistent enforcement of laws prohibiting tobacco possession and use by students and intervention and cessation agency referrals.

Prohibition Against Tobacco Use

Students shall not possess, smoke, or use tobacco, or any product containing tobacco or nicotine, while on campus, while attending SCOE-sponsored activities, or while under the supervision and control of SCOE employees.

Prohibited products include, but are not limited to, cigarettes, cigars, miniature cigars, clove cigarettes, smokeless tobacco, snuff, chew packets, and betel. Students' possession or use of nicotine delivery devices, such as electronic cigarettes, is also prohibited. These prohibitions do not apply to a student's possession or use of his/her own prescription products. (Education Code sections 48900, 48901)

Intervention/Cessation Services

SCOE may provide, or refer students to, counseling, intensive education, and other intervention support services to assist in the prevention, reduction, or cessation of tobacco use. When appropriate, such intervention services may be provided as an alternative to suspension for tobacco possession.

Due to the additional health risks of tobacco use for prenatal development, SCOE shall provide or refer its enrolled pregnant and parenting minors to outreach, motivational, and other support services to prevent or reduce tobacco use among this particular student population. Such services may be integrated with existing programs for pregnant and parenting minors and shall include: (Health and Safety Code section 104460)

- 1. Referral to perinatal and related support services
- 2. Outreach services and assessment of smoking status
- 3. Individualized counseling and advocacy services
- 4. Motivational messages
- 5. Cessation services, if appropriate
- 6. Incentives to maintain a healthy lifestyle
- 7. Follow-up assessment
- 8. Maintenance and relapse prevention services

Information about tobacco-use intervention and cessation programs shall be made available and encouraged for students and staff. These services shall be directed toward current users and shall be voluntary for students who desire assistance in ceasing the use of tobacco. (Health and Safety Code section 104420)
