LEGAL COUNSEL

I. General/In-House Counsel

Recognizing the complex legal environment in which educational institutions operate and desiring to have reliable, dependable legal advice, the County Board of Education may appoint in-house legal counsel to provide unrestricted, independent advice to the Board. The Board and the County Superintendent shall appoint the same legal counsel. (Education Code [E.C.] section 35041.5)

The County Superintendent may confer with such legal counsel at their discretion. Individual Board members may not seek advice from general/in-house legal counsel regarding matters under the Board's jurisdiction. When so directed by a majority of the Board, the County Superintendent may contact such legal counsel to provide the Board with legal information or advice.

II. Special/Outside Counsel

The County Board may contract with outside counsel to provide advice to the Board when the following circumstances exist:

- 1. In-house counsel has a conflict of interest;
- 2. In-house counsel has failed to render timely advice in a particular matter;
- 3. The services being sought are in addition to those usually, ordinarily, and regularly obtained from in-house counsel; or
- 4. The County Board desires a second legal opinion from that provided by in-house counsel in a particular matter.

(E.C. § 1042(d); 86 Ops. Cal. Atty. Gen. 57 (2003))

The County Superintendent and the County Board shall appoint the same special/outside legal counsel.
