Public Hearing for Solano County Board of Education Trustee Area Boundaries Review

Solano County, CA - The Solano County Committee on School District Organization (County Committee) will hold a public hearing Wednesday, December 8, 2021, at 8:00 PM at the Solano County Office of Education (SCOE), located at 5100 Business Center Drive in Fairfield, to hear public input on the trustee area boundaries of the Solano County Board of Education (Board). The boundary review considers which neighborhoods and communities are grouped together into a trustee area for purposes of electing a trustee representative.

Members of the public are invited to attend and address the County Committee in person. Public comments on the topic may also be made online prior to or during the meeting using the [Public Comment](#) form. Education Code requires that Board trustee areas must be analyzed following each decennial census and realigned, if necessary, to account for population shifts. The Board held a public hearing on November 10th to receive a report by Michael Wagaman of Wagaman Strategies regarding Census 2020 data analysis pertaining to the Board's trustee area boundaries. The report confirmed that current boundaries meet the legal equivalency guidelines, and no adjustments through redistricting are needed at this time. If the County Committee agrees with the Board's analysis, existing trustee area boundaries will remain unchanged.
