Solano Youth Resiliency Summit Open for Students and Adults

SOLANO COUNTY, CA – Solano students and adults can still register for the Solano Youth Resiliency Summit held virtually this year on May 15, 2021. The Solano County Office of Education has partnered with Solano County Public Health, Fighting Back Partnership, Nature of Sound, SafeQuest Solano, VIBE Solano, Kaiser Permanente, and the Solano Youth Coalition to host the second summit event for Solano teens.

"The Youth Resiliency Summit will have a wide range of workshops covering topics facing our youth and community. Participants will learn how to help create positive change and develop important skills that strengthen their resiliency," said Superintendent of Schools Lisette Estrella-Henderson. "We are so appreciative of the community partnerships that make this event possible for Solano students."

This year's virtual format is free for all attendees and is scheduled from 10:30 a.m. – 3:00 p.m. on Saturday, May 15, 2021. All Solano County middle and high school students are eligible to attend. For students, the summit will focus on mental health; healthy relationships; alcohol, tobacco and other drug (ATOD) prevention. An adult track will also be offered for educators and community members with a focus on suicide prevention, mental health and wellness, ATOD prevention and more.
