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## **Countywide Contest Brings Awareness to Improve School Attendance**

FAIRFIELD – Solano County Office of Education has joined a nationwide initiative to celebrate Attendance Awareness Month in September, to raise awareness about the value of regular school attendance, with a focus on reducing chronic absenteeism in the new school year.

Good attendance is essential to academic success; unfortunately, students, parents, and the public at large are often unaware how quickly absences, excused or unexcused, can add up. Far too many students are at risk academically because they are chronically absent; described as missing 10 percent of the school year or about 18 days for any reason. Research shows this is the point at which absenteeism begins to affect student performance. "As educators, our goal is to provide each student with every possible opportunity for success We want our students and community to understand that when educational opportunities are missed, students fall behind academically." says Solano County Superintendent of Schools Lisette Estrella-Henderson. "It is vital that we, as a community, continue working to improve attendance throughout the school year."

Regular school attendance matters to all of us, not just to those with school-age children. When our schools graduate more students, on time, our communities and economy are stronger. In September, schools, city agencies, community nonprofits, businesses, and others around the nation are committing time and resources to raise public awareness, map local attendance gaps, and work with community partners to improve school attendance starting as soon as children enter school.

In efforts to raise awareness, the Solano County Office of Education is, once again, sponsoring a countywide poster and public service announcement contest; seeking entries for a peer-to-peer contest among students, focusing on the importance of regular school attendance, as a part of the overall effort to improve school attendance in Solano County.
