TRANSITION PARTNERSHIP PROGRAM (TPP)

Education and Business Partners Transitioning Students from School to Work

A partnership between the Department of Rehabilitation (DOR), Solano County Office of Education (SCOE) and Local School Districts

Benefits to Student

Students 16 years old and older receiving TPP services:

- Gain career skills (Personal Management, Career Management, and Life Management)
- Explore career interests
- Gain skills in interviewing, job applications, resumes, and completing a professional portfolio

Intake Process and Eligibility

Students receiving TPP services at their local high school will complete/submit a DOR eligibility packet. SCOE and DOR will coordinate the initial intake interview with the student. Eligibility is determined within 60 days based on the severity of disability and the following criteria:

- Student has an IEP or 504
- The disability may result in a barrier to obtain and maintain competitive, non-supportive employment



If eligible for TPP services, an IPE is developed by the DOR counselor. The IPE is based on the student's strengths and abilities, and outlines the student's responsibilities to complete their vocational goal. The IPE can be for direct job placement or short term vocational training

The IPE can include:

- Adult Education
- Apprenticeship Programs
- On-the-Job Training
- Community College/ Certificate
 Program

Successful Employment

Once the student completes his/ her vocational goal and is successfully employed for 90 days, their case is closed.



What Students Learn

- Comprehensive career planning
- Importance of making informed career choice
- Importance of having career goals
- Learn the meaning and value of work
- Identify career strengths and abilities
- Identify and communicate accommodations to help succeed (self-advocacy)
- Learn to present themselves well for greater employment opportunities
- Learn how to complete financial aid and college applications
- Practice positive communication skills
- Know legal rights and responsibilities
- Learn time management and organization skills
- Understand tax system and payroll deductions
- Learn banking options
- Understand how choices affect ability to live within their means
- Learn how to make healthy leisure choices
- Career interest field trips
- Up to 100 hours of paid placement, with recommendation
